"Teach them to your children"

"Only take heed to yourself, and diligently keep yourself, lest you forget the things your eyes have seen, and lest they depart from your heart all the days of your life. And teach them to your children and your grandchildren," Deutt. 4:9 (NKJ)

The word "teach" is found 108 times in the King James Version of the Bible. In both Old and New Testaments God emphasizes over and over again the importance of teaching our children and others about Him. In the text noted above from Deut. 4:9, Moses exhorts Israel to keep in their minds at all times those things which God had done for them. The Lord had delivered them from bondage, had cared for them as they journeyed in the wilderness, and had brought them to the borders of the promised land. Throughout all of these experiences He had demonstrated Himself as the omnipotent God through the miracles the Israelites had witnessed. Now Moses is reminding Israel of all these things. They dare not forget the parting of the Red Sea, the manna and quail in the wilderness, the water at Meribah or the giving of the Law at Sinai. The reason is obvious, "out of sight, out of mind!" Without "taking heed" to self, i.e., paying attention to that which is important in their lives, they would forget. They would forget the very God who had provided for their salvation! Not only that, but, in forgetting God themselves, they would not **teach** the next generation about God. What a crime!

Do we feel the same urgency today to remember what God has done for us, and to teach those things to our children? Do we remember that "For God so loved the world, that he gave his only begotten Son, that whosoever believeth in him should not perish, but have everlasting life." (John 3:6)? Do we teach this truth to our children? Do we remember that Christ died for us so that our sins could be forgiven, that he was buried and rose again the third day (1 Cor 15:3,4)? Do teach this to our children? Do we remember our own obedience to the gospel in belief, repentance, confession and baptism (Mk. 16:15,16, Rom. 10:9, Acts 2:38)? Do we teach our children that this is God's plan for them as well? Do we "take heed" to remember the necessity of faithful living all of our lives as Christians (Rev. 2:10)? Do we teach our children this in word and deed?

Remember, our Lord has charged us to be teachers of the Word (Mt. 28:20). Let's each do what we can to ensure that the next generation is "grounded and settled" in the faith (Col. 1:23)
