Remembering Christ

Christ commands his disciples to remember him in only two texts in the New Testament (Luke 22:19 and 1Cor. 11:24,24)! I find that somewhat amazing, considering the emphasis that is placed on this remembrance. When we gather around the Lord's table each Lord's Day, according to the authority given in Acts 20:7, we remember our Lord in the partaking of the memorial feast he has left for us. We do not choose the method by which we remember the Lord. He has prescribed it! As we actively engage in this exercise of remembrance, what should we remember? Consider the following:

We need to remember Christ as our SAVIOR

The angels declared in Luke 2:11 that there was born in the city of David a **Savior** who was the Christ, the Lord. Paul tells the Corinthian brethren in 1Cor. 15:3, "For I delivered to you first of all that which I also received: that Christ **died for our sins** according to the scriptures."

In Acts 4:12, Peter declares that there is salvation in none other, "for there is no other name under heaven given among men by which we must be saved." (NKJ) The Samaritans in John chapter 4, by there own observations, recognized Christ as the "Savior of the world." Jn. 4:2. Christ indeed is the one who purchased our salvation with his own blood. He is our Savior!

We need to remember Christ as our MEDIATOR

Paul tells Timothy in 1 Tim. 2:5 that Christ is the "one Mediator between God and man....". The Hebrew writer declares Christ to be "the Apostle and **High Priest** of our confession" in chapter 3, verse1. Also, in Hebrews 8:6 it is affirmed that Christ is "Mediator of a better covenant, which was established on better promises."

We need to remember Christ as our KING

Consider what Paul says in 1 Tim. 6:15-16: "which He will manifest in His own time, He who is the blessed and only Potentate, the **King of kings** and Lord of lords, who alone has immortality, dwelling in unapproachable light, whom no man has seen or can see, to whom be honor and everlasting power. Amen". (NKJ) Jesus told his apostles in Mt. 38:18 that "all authority" had been given to him in heaven and on earth. He is our king!

■ We need to remember Christ as our BROTHER

Jesus considers his disciples as brethren. Note his statement in Mt. 12:49-50: "And He stretched out HIs hand toward His disciples and said, "Here are my mother and My brothers! "For whoever does the will of My Father in heaven is My brother and sister and mother." (NKJ) If you are a Christian, Christ is your brother!

Let's remember Christ according to **his** will, according to the manner **he** prescribes. Remember John's statement in 2Jn. 1:9:

"Whoever transgresses and does not abide in the doctrine of Christ does not have God. He who abides in the doctrine of Christ has both the Father and the Son." (NKJ
