Hating What God Hates

These six things the LORD hates, yes, seven are an abomination to Him: A proud look, a lying tongue, hands that shed innocent blood, A heart that devises wicked plans, feet that are swift in running to evil, A false witness who speaks lies, and one who sows discord among brethren. Prov. 6:16-19 (NKJ)

As I searched through the file marked "Articles" for some inspiration for this month's article, I ran across an old clipping from the *Courier Journal*, a letter to the editor. The letter was written by Sam B. Peavey, a professor emeritus at the University of Louisville, and was in response to an editorial in the *Courier* on a "hate crimes" ordinance being considered at the time by the Louisville Board of Aldermen. Mr. Peavey appropriately pointed out that hating is not all bad. What one hates reflects what one loves. He candidly observed, "Today our homes and schools clearly mirror a society wallowing in a value vacuum and situational ethics and moral relativism. Open minds too often reflect empty minds. Positive thinking may leave us positively unthinking." According to Peavey's assessment of modern society, the source of moral and social decay has come from "...our infatuation with the lusts of our human nature, to our indulgence in promiscuous and perverted life styles...."

Now let's consider what the Christian should hate.

As our text (Prov. 6:16-19) points out, God hates several things: pride, lying, murder, plotting evil, eagerness to do wrong, a false witness and sowing discord among brethren. In Proverbs 16:8 **pride** is associated with that which destroys. It can destroy individuals, relationships, and congregations. It is a character trait molded by the world (1 Jn. 2:16). **Lying** is contrary to sound doctrine (1 Tim. 1:10) and will have its reward (Rev. 21:8). The **taking of innocent life** has always been condemned since Cain took his brother's life (Gen. 4:8). **Plotting evil** and eagerly pursuing means and opportunities to carry it out has been associated with those who are the enemies of God and righteousness (Matt. 26:16). Betrayal at the hands of **false witnesses** took the life of our Lord (Mt. 26:60). And discord among brethren and the division it produces is, according to the Lord, a sign of carnality or worldliness (1 Cor. 3:3).

Knowing what God hates helps us to appreciate the more what He loves: humility (1 Pet. 5:5), truth (Jn. 17:17), justice (Prov. 21:3), living righteously (Titus 2:12) doing good (Acts 10:38), honesty (Rom. 12:17) and unity (1 Cor. 1:10).

Do you hate what God hates, or do you find yourself loving the world and the things in the world, contrary to God's instructions (1 Jn. 2:15)?

That which we exhibit in our lives tells all who know us and are associated with us where our heart is and what our priorities are. Let's begin today to hate what God hates and love what God loves!
