The authority of Christ's word is the basis for unity among His followers

One of the most obvious things in the New Testament is that Jesus desired that those who profess to be His followers should be unified in their faith and practice (Jn. 17:20,21). But it is equally obvious that the world of so-called "Christendom" is not unified today. There are literally hundreds of different groups of congregations, each with distinctive doctrines that set them apart from all others. These disagreements over even the fundamentals of the faith cannot be pleasing to Jesus Christ. But what can be done about it? What kind of unity would the Lord have us pursue?

Some try to achieve unity by simply saying that the differences are not important. This approach basically says that there is room in the Lord's church for people to believe whatever they feel like believing, even on the most important subjects. But while "agreeing to disagree" produces union, it does not produce the kind of unity that the Lord desires. Truth is not simply anything we want it to be. It makes a significant difference what we believe and practice (1 Tim. 4:1,2; 2 Tim. 4:3,4; etc.), and the differences that divide "Christendom" cannot be ignored.

In Jesus' prayer for His disciples, He prayed that they might be "sanctified," or "made distinctive," by the truth: "Sanctify them in the truth; your word is truth" (Jn. 17:17). This is the only worthy way to gather the Lord's people together and make them distinctive. *The authority of Christ's word is the basis for unity among His followers.* We need to diligently and reverently submit all of our differences to Christ's teaching and seek to reach a common understanding of what His will is. This is hard, time-consuming work, but the results are worth it.

If we individually grow closer to God, based upon the truth of His word, we will obviously be growing closer to one another in the process. Among human beings, it doesn't matter so much who is right — it only matters what is right. Whatever the differences may be, the main thing that we must decide is what the Lord's will is. When we discover His will and do it, we will enjoy among ourselves the kind of unity that Jesus prayed for. Throughout the coming week, therefore, let's consider the importance of growing in unity by growing in the truth. In all things, our goal should be to grow toward "the measure of the stature of the fullness of Christ" (Eph. 4:13).
