Key Differences Between Boss and Leader The significant differences between boss and leader are discussed in the following points:

-A Boss is a person in charge at the office who gives the order to employees and behaves in an authoritative way, seeks control and tells his men what to do. A leader is a person who leads other by influencing, inspiring, supporting and encouraging a group of individuals, and works continuously on the achievement of the goal.

-A boss has employees whereas a leader has followers.

-A boss administers and rules by fear while a leader innovates and inspires with trust.



Key Differences Between Boss and Leader The significant differences between boss and leader are discussed in the following points:

-A boss gains respect due to his authority or seniority, but a leader earns respect for himself by his conduct, goodwill and quality of character.

-A boss is always profit oriented. Conversely, a leader is people oriented.

-A boss exercises control, unlike leader who seeks commitment.

-A boss takes decisions on the basis of standards, organization's norms and rule. As opposed to a leader whose conduct is based on the values.



Key Differences Between Boss and Leader The significant differences between boss and leader are discussed in the following points:

-A boss very well knows how to perform a particular task. On the contrary, a leader shows his followers how to do the task properly.

-A boss assigns tasks and delegate responsibilities to his men. However, a leader delegates authorities.

-A boss tells employees what to do. On the other hand, a leader teaches employees what to do.

-A boss places blame for the breakdown and point out the who is wrong. In contrast to the leader, who fixes the breakdown and identifies what is wrong.

-Leadership is a quality of influencing people, so that the objectives are attained willingly and enthusiastically

-Management is the techniques of utilizing assets in the most profitable manner.



Key Differences Between Manager and Leader The significant differences between manager and leader are discussed in the following points:

- Leadership is a virtue of leading people through encouraging them.
 Management is a process of managing the activities of the organisation.
- Leadership requires trust of followers on his leader. Unlike Management, which needs control of manager over its subordinates.
- Leadership is a skill of influencing others while Management is the quality of the ruling.
- Leadership demands foresightedness of leader, but Management has a short range vision.
- In leadership, principles and guidelines are established, whereas, in the case of management, policies and procedures are implemented.
- Leadership is Proactive. Conversely, management is reactive in nature.
- Leadership brings change. On the other hand, Management brings stability.
