A Life Worthy of the Gospel

Philippians 1:27-30

Introduction: The Apostle Paul said: "Only conduct yourselves in a manner worthyof the gospel of Christ." What kind of conduct did he mean? What manner of life does God expect of me to compliment the gospel? Let's observe 3!

How do I live a life worthy of the gospel?

#1 A Life of Perseverance. (v.27b) "I will hear of you that you are standing firm in one spirit, with one mind striving together for the faith of the gospel;"

- A. Moses told the Israelites to Persevere. (Exo 14:13)
- **B.** Jahaziel told the Judeans to Persevere. (2 Ch 20:17)
- **C.** Peter told his readers to Persevere. (1 Pe 5:12)
- **D.** Paul told the Corinthians to Persevere. (1 Co 10:13)

How do I live a life worthy of the gospel?

#2 A Life of Courage. (v.28) "in no way alarmed by your opponents-- which is a sign of destruction for them, but of salvation for you, and that too, from God."

- A. Nehemiah Encouraged the builders. (Neh 4:14)
- **B.** Paul was Encouraged. (2 Ti 1:7)
- C. Jesus Encouraged His disciples. (Mat 10:26-28)

How do I live a life worthy of the gospel?

#3 A Life of Suffering. (v.29-30) "For to you it has been granted for Christ's sake, not only to believe in Him, but also to suffer for His sake, experiencing the same conflict which you saw in me, and now hear to be in me."

- A. Peter said the righteous would Suffer. (1 Pe 3:14)
- **B.** James said the righteous would Suffer. (Jam 1:12)
- **C.** Paul said the righteous would Suffer. *(Phi 3:10-11)*
- **D.** Paul said the righteous would be Glorified! (Rom 8:18)

Conclusion: (Gal 6:9) is another place where Paul tells the churches to live a life that is worthy of the gospel. He says: "Let us not lose heart in doing good, for in duetime we will reap if we do not grow weary."

The Physical Courage of Courageous Christians

The writer of Hebrews wrote an amazing chapter on great examples of those of faith in Old Testament history. This is Hebrews chapter 11. Its 40 verses give many detailed examples of conviction that we can learn from and apply to our lives. The Hebrews writer introduces the topic by both abstractly defining faith and pointing out that faith explains the Creation (Heb 11:1-3). Let's look at four examples of Physical Courage in the lives of Christians today:

1. Courage for Christians Going Against the Flow.

Faith is expressed first in the Pre-deluvian era from Abel to Noah in (Heb 11:4-7). Abel was courageous in offering an acceptable offering to God in spite of his brother Cain's lack of effort (Gen 4:3-5). Enoch also was a great person of faith that even avoided death being righteous in his generation (Gen 5:24). Finally, Noah was a great man of faith who found grace in the eyes of the Lord (Gen 6:8). He saved his family, condemned the world, and possessed a righteous character (Gen 7:1). He was physically courageous when the rest of his world stood against God. Abel, Enoch and Noah give Christians who do not go along with what is popular with the world needed encouragement (Gen 8:20-22).

2. Courage for Christians in Old Age.

Faith is also expressed in the Patriarchal period in (Heb 11:8-22). Both Abraham and Sarah obtained a land with unquestioned faith (Rom 4:18). Sarah specifically overcame barrenness and began a nation (Gen 21:1-2). They, like us, were spiritual pilgrims of sorts. They had faith in the unseen because they trusted God along their spiritual journeys (2 Co 4:18; Heb 11:1). They, like us, looked forward to seeing the city of God and obtaining the approval of God (Heb 11:10-11). They are great examples to older Christians to have physical courage in spite of their physical limitations (2 Co 12:9). Later, the faith of Abraham, Isaac, Jacob, and Joseph are shown (Gen 50:24-25). Abraham believed in God's power (Rom 4:18-24). Isaac, Jacob, and Joseph all faithfully blessed their sons before dying with the future promises in mind (Gen 46:27). These Patriarchs displayed great physical courage as they inherited the promises of God from Abraham (Gen 12:1-3).

3. Courage for Christians in Leadership.

Faith is again expressed through the life of Moses in (Heb 11:23-29). As a young man, he believed God, was enabled by godly parents (Num 26:59), and opposed the pleasures of sin (Heb 11:24-25) and world's riches (Num 12:3). In adulthood, he opposed the king (Exo 7:16), observed the Passover (Exo 12:21-24), and overcame the Red Sea by God's power (Exo 14:21-31). All these actions took great physical courage as he led God's people to the doorstep of the promised land. He is an excellent example of courage to leaders among God's people (Exo 5:1).

4. Courage for Christians in Trying Circumstances.

Finally, we see examples of faith in Israel after the life of Moses in (Heb 11:30-40). Numerous people in the history of Israel had great faith. For example, God's people shouted down a city and Rahab organized the Hebrew spies' safety in (Heb 11:30-31). Many more heroes of the faith are mentioned later in this passage that needed great physical courage to overcome the challenges they faced for God (Heb 11:32-35). They endured much suffering for God but He rewarded them in the end (Mat 5:11-12; Rom 8:17). This is shown in our concluding passage in (Heb 11:39-40). Here, the delayed blessing of a new time (the Kingdom of God) would be revealed. The faithful received a temporary approval in the past but will receive eternal approval in the future (Mat 25:23). Are you prepared to live the Christian life with physical courage (Phi 4:13)? Know that God's promises will see you through (John 15:7)!
