Hope Is Our Most Priceless Treasure in Christ

". . . if indeed you continue in the faith, grounded and steadfast, and are not moved away from the hope of the gospel which you heard, which was preached to every creature under heaven, of which I, Paul, became a minister" (Colossians 1:23).

Among our many blessings in Christ, the hope of heaven is the center around which all the others orbit. Eternal life is "the hope of the gospel," as Paul calls it, the one thing promised by the gospel to every faithful Christian and only to them. Things like physical health, financial security, and even emotional health may be found outside of Christ; indeed, they are sometimes enjoyed by worldly people to a greater extent than Christians. But "the hope of the gospel" is a gift that is absolutely unique: it is promised to everyone in Christ and only those in Christ.

When I speak of our "hope" in Christ, I don't mean (at least primarily) the subjective feeling of hope. I mean the fact of eternal life, the object of the Christian's hope. From time to time, the Christian may have a buoyant feeling of hope when he ponders heaven, and sometimes he may not. But the objective reality of "the hope of the gospel" does not change as long as we are faithful to Christ.

This hope can be ours only because of God's grace. If it were not for the atoning sacrifice of His Son, Jesus Christ, there would be no hope of heaven for us. To say that we didn't deserve this gift is to say the painfully obvious, but the very fact that we are so undeserving is what makes us treasure our hope all the more gratefully.

This most priceless of our treasures is the central core of "walking in Christ." It's the spring from which our joy and strength flow, and our enjoyment of other blessings must never draw our hearts away or distract us from keeping the main thing.

But if that is the What? of our hope, what is the So What? Here are five things. (1) We should cherish our hope with profound humility. (2) We should guard our hope for all it's worth, being steadfast and faithful. (3) We should purify ourselves, as John said in 1 John 3:3. (4) We should long passionately for its arrival, fixing our meditations on it daily. (5) We should be evangelistic and talk of our hope in Christ to everyone who'll listen. For in the end, to lose eternity with God will be to lose the one thing that ever truly mattered.
